EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Epistle Reading is from the Letter of Saint Paul to the Galatians, chapter 6, verses 11-18. It is found in our books on page 122.

Οὐδὲ γὰρ οἱ περιτετμημένοι αὐτοὶ νόμον φυλάσσουσιν, ἀλλὰ θέλουσιν ὑμᾶς περιτέμνεσθαι, ἵνα ἐν τῆ ὑμετέρα σαρκὶ καυχήσωνται. Ἐμοὶ δὲ μὴ γένοιτο καυχᾶσθαι εὶ μὴ ἐν τῷ σταυρῷ τοῦ κυρίου ἡμῶν Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ δι' οὖ ἐμοὶ κόσμος ἐσταύρωται, κὰγὼ τῷ κόσμφ. Ἐν γὰρ Χριστῷ Ἰησοῦ οὕτε περιτομή τι ἰσχύει, οὕτε ἀκροβυστία, ἀλλὰ καινὴ κτίσις. Καὶ ὅσοι τῷ κανόνι τούτφ στοιχήσουσιν, εἰρήνη ἐπ' αὐτούς, καὶ ἔλεος, καὶ ἐπὶ τὸν Ἰσραὴλ τοῦ θεοῦ. Τοῦ λοιποῦ, κόπους μοι μηδεὶς παρεχέτω· ἐγὼ γὰρ τὰ στίγματα τοῦ κυρίου Ἰησοῦ ἐν τῷ σώματί μου βαστάζω. Ἡ χάρις τοῦ κυρίου ἡμῶν Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ μετὰ τοῦ πνεύματος ὑμῶν, ἀδελφοί. Ἁμήν.

GOSPEL READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Gospel Reading is from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, chapter 8, verses 41-56. It is found in our books, pages 253-257.

Today's Apolytikion (Dismissal Hymn) is that of Tone Five (Plagal 1):

Eternal with the Father and the Spirit is the Word, who of a Virgin was begotten for our salvation. As the faithful, we both praise and worship Him for, in the flesh did He consent to ascend unto the Cross, and death did He endure, and the dead He raised unto life though His all-glorious Resurrection.

TODAY'S GUEST PREACHER: We are blessed today by the presence and message of **Monk Maximos** (Constas). Father Maximos is Senior Research Scholar at Holy Cross Greek Orthodox School of Theology in Brookline, MA. He holds a Ph.D. in Patristics and Historical Theology from the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. He was a Professor of Theology at Harvard Divinity School, after which he became a Monk at Simonopetra Monastery, Mt. Athos. Father Maximos will be speaking at a retreat of all Orthodox clergy which begins tomorrow at St. Nicholas Ranch and Retreat Center.

What we are asking for 2015 is that you also consider what you might be able to give *each month* to support your community and its ministries. This will greatly help the Cathedral with its budget management. On November 12, the Stewardship Committee will convene to further consider our stewardship goals for 2015 and to plan Stewardship Sunday, December 7, which will be offered through the generosity of Gus and Georgia Vouchilas.

A thought: In their book on Orthodox Christian leadership, entitled Oriented Leadership, Williams and McKibben, the authors, define stewardship as the call of the faithful to share willingly the gifts that God has bestowed on them. It is not simply the giving of a monetary sum. Rather stewardship is our active commitment to use all our time, talent and treasure for the benefit of humankind in grateful acknowledgment of Christ's redeeming love.

Meanwhile, things are moving along and, now, quite rapidly. Tomorrow we will receive rebar steel as we will next Monday, November 10. The rebar will be laid over the deck forming, now that the mechanical, electrical and plumbing conduits are in place. This will take a few weeks. Then, on December 8 (God willing, and weather permitting) we will have the first of two pours of concrete. The parking structure ceiling (which is also the Cathedral floor deck) will now be complete and the vertical steel will start going up. In the November Herald you no doubt saw photos of the dome steel. We can't wait to get to that point. However, we you're your monetary support and we need your prayers. To date, we have just under 300 donors. This list needs to grow to at least 500. Their names will be inscribed on the dedication wall in the new Cathedral, where prayers will be constantly offered "for the blessed and ever-memorable founders and benefactors of this Holy Church." Ask yourself, as you read this, is your name among them?

In the Book of Exodus (25:8) God says: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (Translated from the Septuagint: Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἀγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι ἐν ὑμῖν). We've quoted this at least since the start of the Capital Campaign, and we are keeping this "immovable before our eyes," as Deut. 6:8 states. As we rebuild the Cathedral to God's glory, to serve our faithful and all God's people in this blessed dynamic heart of San Francisco.
