EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Epistle Reading is from St. Paul's Letter to the Romans, chapter 12, verses 6-14. It is found in our books on page 100.

GOSPEL READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Gospel Reading is from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew, chapter 9, verses 1-8. It is found in our books on pages 207-209.

Today's Apolytikion (Dismissal Hymn) is that of Tone Five (Plagal 1):

Eternal with the Father and the Spirit is the Word, who of a Virgin was begotten for our salvation. As the faithful, we both praise and worship Him for, in the flesh did He consent to ascend unto the Cross, and death did He endure, and the dead He raised unto life though His all-glorious Resurrection.

A reminder why the Liturgy (our communal prayer offering) begins with the words, "In peace..." The most elusive of all human quests. And, yet, the most realizable when one believes in Christ, the Prince of Peace. For, in God, there is peace. As we offer memorial services next Sunday, July 19, for those whose lives were lost during the invasion, we pray "for the peace of the whole world..."

These words have reverberated in our hearts ever since, becoming our Mission Statement and our Vision Statement as we rebuild God's house "in which the Holy Name of our Triune God shall be extolled and all of creation sanctified." STILL LOOKING AHEAD: FOOD FESTIVAL SEPTEMBER 18, 19, 20: Please note it on your calendars. As stated in the *Herald*, our coordinator and chairs are in place and the dates are set. This year's Festival will take place on our grounds, similar to last year, Friday through Sunday, September 18 through 20. The festival is about making money to support the Cathedral's ministries but, even more importantly, about building community, both our own faith community, and the community at large. When we went before the Planning Department to submit our plans to rebuild the Cathedral, and the hearings that followed, we still recall how some neighbors just showed up in support of the project, saying things like "we love the Cathedral, which we got to know through its Food Festival, and we're here to speak in favor of its rebuilding." Talk about community building! The next meeting of the Food Festival Committee will take place Tuesday, July 14 in the second floor conference room, 7 p.m.

WE'RE DONE WITH THE STEEL COLUMNS, DECKING

At long last, we are finished with the installation of the red iron steel and the steel decking (the steel which will support the clay tile roof and the dome metal). This week, the concrete lower walls for the Cathedral and the planters were poured. This coming week, installation of the steel studs will begin.

Excitement mounts as we watch this magnificent structure evolve, for this structure represents everything we are and everything we believe as Greek Orthodox Christians. It is a symbol of what our immigrant parents and grandparents brought to this land. It is also a symbol of what our own generation has cultivated, and what we hope to leave for the generations to come.

We noted that we've reached the \$10 million mark. And we have explained how much has been spent and on what, as well as how much we have to go in order to complete the Cathedral. Additionally, we have projected a timetable for completion of the project. We're looking at completing the exterior this time next year. This includes the normal functioning of the garage. And, we're looking at beginning work on the interior at that time; this should take another year.

May God bless this of ours, for God is the one who spoke to Moses, then, and who speaks to us, today, saying: "Build me a Sanctuary, and I will appear among you." (Translated from the Septuagint: Καὶ ποιήσεις μοι ἀγίασμα, καὶ ὀφθήσομαι έν ὑμὶν). (Exodus 25:8).
