FIFTH SUNDAY OF LUKE

EPISTLE READING OF THE DAY: This morning's Apostolic Reading is from the Second Letter of Saint Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 11, Verse 31 – Chapter 12, Verse 9. It is found in our books on pages 118-119.

Ὑπὲς τοῦ τοιούτου καυχήσομαι· ὑπὲς δὲ ἐμαυτοῦ οὐ καυχήσομαι, εἰ μὴ ἐν ταῖς ἀσθενείαις μου· ἐὰν γὰς θελήσω καυχήσασθαι, οὐκ ἔσομαι ἄφρων· ἀλήθειαν γὰς ἐςῶ· φείδομαι δέ, μή τις εἰς ἐμὲ λογίσηται ὑπὲς ὁ βλέπει με, ἢ ἀκούει τι ἐξ ἐμοῦ.
